Dear Member,

As Board President of the White House Water System (WHWS), I have worked diligently for you to act on things that I heard the membership asking for. As I entered this position, I knew that our main priorities this year needed to be:

- 1) Stabilizing our delivery systems and reducing water loss;
- 2) Creating accountability;
- 3) Lowering rates; and
- 4) Providing you the opportunity to vote on a transfer of White House Water System to North Baldwin Utilities.

As your Board President, I am happy to announce we were successful with the first three and the fourth will be voted on at this year's annual meeting. Included on the ballot, you will vote to fill 2 board seats as well as whether we will merge with NBU. Please read this letter along with all enclosures carefully. They will outline our plan to carry out the election in accordance with our Declaration of Incorporation and Bylaws (as amended). We have also included a copy of a Resolution adopted by the WHWS Board of Directors on March 25, 2024, that outlines (with exhibits) the offer that has been presented to the White House Water System by NBU.

Our system is in a better position now than we have been in a very, very long time. That is due to the board working together and keeping your interests at heart. Ensuring accountability, as well as the decision to have NBU run our outside operations (while we manage our office staff) has proved to be beneficial for WHWS. This resulted in instant and measurable improvements in service, processes, and stability. It also allowed WHWS to leverage the economies of scale in working with NBU resulting in a reduction in rates for our customers. While the price of everything seems to be going up, we were able to manage the system to reduce costs and provide a much better service.

This board supports the attached resolution as we believe this is a fair offer and outcome for all. However, to be clear, if a majority choose to remain a separate entity, economies of scale would no longer apply. If WHWS members vote to remain independent, we cannot guarantee your low rates will continue nor can we promise we wouldn't have to raise rates to accommodate the repairs and maintenance items needed that are in addition to the repairs covered in the grant we received. We will respect the decisions of the 66% majority required to trigger such a change. All election timelines and processes have been discussed with our legal counsel and they comply with our Declaration of Incorporation as well as our Bylaws, as amended.

There are three (3) ways for you to vote:

- 1) **REQUEST A PROXY BALLOT:** If you would like to vote before the annual meeting, you will need to request that a proxy ballot be mailed to you. You may do so by calling the office or emailing the office through the website. Your proxy ballot must be signed and returned to the office no later than 4:00PM on Saturday, April 20, 2024.
- 2) IN PERSON PROXY VOTING: WHWS will hold in-person proxy voting on Saturday, April 20 from 10:AM to 4:00PM at the WHWS office. If you did not previously request that a proxy ballot be mailed to you, you will be able to receive one in person on April 20.

Any proxy ballots not RECEIVED at the office by 4:00PM Saturday, April 20, 2024 will be set aside, (sealed) and the office staff will make every effort to notify the remaining members that their vote cannot be counted UNLESS they vote in person at the annual meeting.

The unopened proxy ballots will be marked received on our roster, then placed in a lockbox. The only key to that lockbox will be kept by the Baldwin County Sheriff's office. On April 20, 2024, at 4:00PM, the onsite deputy will seal the top of the box with tape and take it to the Sheriff's office for safekeeping.

Proxy Ballots received at the office AFTER April 20 and up until the day of the annual meeting will be recorded as late, marked on our roster as such, and deposited in another locked box. The office staff will make every effort to reach out to you, the member, to allow you to "cure" your ballot by voting in person at the annual meeting.

3) **ANNUAL MEETING**: Members that did not timely submit a proxy ballot may vote in person at the Annual Meeting on Tuesday, April 30, 2024. Doors will open at 6:00PM. Upon arrival you can request a ballot to vote in person during the annual meeting.

Note: All ballots and envelopes are unique to each member as they will contain your member number. Only one ballot per account. The person signing the ballot <u>MUST</u> be the person named on the account.

At 3:00PM on the day of the annual meeting, a voting committee of 4 members, plus a sheriff's deputy, and our CPA will open the lock box and begin counting all properly submitted proxy ballots. Two members will verify and open, and two will tabulate the votes and ensure they are recorded correctly. Only our CPA, the sheriff's deputy, WHWS's voting committee, and our legal counsel will be allowed in that room. No other members will be allowed to watch in person. We will, however, livestream the process on YouTube, and we will provide the link to members upon request.

At 6:00PM, doors will open for the annual meeting. If you have not previously voted via proxy, you can pick up a ballot in person at the meeting. **NOTE:** you MUST stay during the meeting and will be called up to return your ballot and present proper identification. The meeting will pause to allow all votes to be tabulated and the CPA will declare the result.

We have two board seats open, and their bios are attached. Proxy ballots and ballots will also include a spot for write-in candidates should you prefer to choose your own. The margin required for Board Member election is 50% of all votes plus one.

The margin to approve the proposition to merge with NBU will require a 66% majority of all members voting (either by proxy or at the annual meeting) to trigger any change.

Because it is so important, we are going to give every member who votes a \$10 (Ten dollar) bill credit. Should the merger be affirmed, every member, regardless of whether or not they voted, will receive an additional \$100 (One Hundred dollar) bill credit. WHITE HOUSE WATER SYSTEM, INC BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESOLUTION 2024-01

RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE DISPOSITION OF ALL ASSETS OF THE CORPORATION TO NORTH BALDWIN UTILITIES, A PUBLIC NONPROFIT CORPORATION

WHEREAS, White House Water System, Inc. (the "Corporation") was organized in 1971 as a nonprofit special purpose entity for mutual benefit through the application of cooperation to provide a water distribution system to the rural areas known as the White House Fork community, at a time when no other municipal or other public water service provider was capable of providing such services to the area; and

WHEREAS, over the course of the past 50+ years, the Corporation has constructed, maintained, and operated a water delivery system to a membership base that has grown to over 2,000 members ("Members"); and

WHEREAS, advances in water systems technology and increased costs associated with operating and sufficiently maintaining a rural water system have resulted in the Corporation's system being at a disadvantage to larger public systems, which are able to create economies of scale to increase efficiency and provide lower rates for consumers of water services; and

WHEREAS, the Declaration of Incorporation of the Corporation authorizes the sale, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge, or other disposition of all or substantially all of the property and assets of the Corporation upon the recommendation of the Board of Directors of the Corporation (the "Board") and approval by the Members; and

WHEREAS, North Baldwin Utilities, a public nonprofit corporation organized in 1945 pursuant to Alabama law for the purpose of providing water, sewer, and gas service to residents of the City of Bay Minette and surrounding unincorporated areas ("NBU") has offered to acquire the assets of the Corporation and take over the operation and maintenance of the Corporation's water delivery system; and

WHEREAS, details regarding NBU's proposal are set forth on Exhibit A hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the board of directors of the Corporation deems it to be in the best interests of the Corporation and its Members to enter into an Asset Transfer Agreement (the "Asset Transfer

Agreement") by and between the Corporation and NBU, pursuant to which the Corporation will transfer all or substantially all of its assets and liabilities to NBU.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD OF DIRECTORS of WHITE HOUSE WATER SYSTEM, INC., as follows:

- 1. The Board of Directors hereby recommends that the Members approve the disposition of all of the assets of the Corporation and authorize the Board of Directors to fix the terms and conditions of the Asset Transfer Agreement. Pursuant to the Declaration of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Corporation, such authorization shall require the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the Members voting, whether in person or by proxy, at the annual meeting to be held on April 30, 2024.
- 2. The Officers of the Corporation are hereby authorized and empowered to take all such further actions, including the execution and delivery of all such further agreements, certificates, instruments, and documents, in the name and on behalf of the Corporation, and the payment of any expenses, as they or any of them shall deem necessary, desirable, advisable, or appropriate to consummate, effectuate, carry out, or further the transactions contemplated by and the intent and purposes of this Resolution; and that any and all such actions heretofore or hereafter taken by the Officers hereby are adopted, affirmed, approved, and ratified in all respects as the act and deed of the Corporation.


